On May 17, the City Council agreed to assist the Resource Centre for the Arts with a 50% contribution towards a Feasibility Study on the L.S.P.U. Hall.

RCA has applied for funds under the Cultural Spaces Canada program for the study, which will determine the present condition of the building and make plans for future renovations and maintenance.

We appreciate the City's support of this project.

Not to be missed, the **Fourth Annual Nickel Independent Film and Video Festival** runs from June 23 - 26, 2004. The Nickel Independent Film and Video Festival is firmly rooted in presenting films from Newfoundland and Labrador, and includes national and international selections.

This four day extravaganza has grown in excitement and prestige in its first three years. Included in this year's festival are several prominent works from Newfoundland and Labrador; Bloomsday Cabaret by Producer/ Director Rosemary House will open the festival and Making Love in St. Pierre, produced by Ken Pittman and directed by John Vatcher, will be screened on closing night.
